## GOSHEN

The northeastern territory of the NILE Delta in Egypt. Perhaps because it was situated so far from the Nile and its irrigation canals, Goshen was not highly valued by the Egyptians. Jacob and his family were granted permission to settle in this fertile section of Egypt during Joseph's rule as prime minister of Egypt (Gen 46:28).

During the time of the Exodus, Goshen was protected from the plagues of flies (Ex 8:22) and hail (Ex 9:26) which engulfed the rest of Egypt. The district was not large, containing perhaps 900 square miles, and it had two principal cities: Rameses and Pithom. During its long history, Rameses had at least three other names: Zoan, Avaris, and Tanis. It was also the capital of the HYKSOS peoples for several centuries.
