What do Jesus' words mean to you? While generally spoken to Jews before the coming of the indwelling Spirit, His words apply today to each and every Christian to help in living one's life according to His way. Even though Mark is the shortest of the gospels, the summary of the individual recorded episodes are generally longer and greater in content given us more detail and insight into Jesus' actions than the other gospels. It likely records the observations of Peter, the closest apostle to Jesus. The course will be a verse-by-verse study conducted over two quarters. When completed, Mark might be your favorite gospel!
